Every other year people from across the country whose lives are touched by Spina Bifida come together to attend conference sessions from some of the nation's leading doctors, researchers and other professionals in their respected fields. Personally, I had not attended national conference since I was a young child, so the opportunity to increase my network of adults with Spina Bifida was very appealing.

This year national conference was attended by over 700 people. If you came to our chapter conference this year, you know how powerful it is to be with new and old friends and their families from across the state. National conference is like that but on a bigger scale. I had the privilege of meeting other people with Spina Bifida from all over the country. people who understand what it means to live with Spina Bifida and who I could relate to on an incredible level. I also met families with young children who have Spina Bifida. For them, I think it was powerful to see the range of possibilities that lay ahead for their children.

While the conference was a wonderful opportunity to meet new people, there were also presenters on a variety of topics, ranging from urology and neurology, to health and fitness, to advocating for yourself and reaching your full potential. National conference brings together some of the nation's top experts and gives participants the opportunity to ask questions to increase their quality of life. At SBANENY, we frequently talk about resources throughout the state and how much it varies from city to city. On a national scale that variety is even more obvious. I hope to be able to attend the 42nd National Spina Bifida Association Conference in 2018. 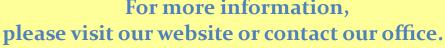

Spina Bifida Association National Conference

Beyond All Limits National SBA Conference Submitted by Karen Wentworth, Executive Director

The Conference

For four days at the end of June, over 750 people traveled from around the country to Minneapolis, Minnesota for the national Spina Bifida Association biennial conference. Those attending included adults of all ages with Spina Bifida, parents of children with Spina Bifida, and children with Spina Bifida and their siblings. Also in attendance were leaders of affiliated chapters of SBA and health care providers who serve people with Spina Bifida. I was privileged to attend the conference with the SBANENY Board Chair, Lyndsi Holmes-Wickert.

My Experience

This was the fifth such conference that I have attended as a representative of SBANENY. I find the experience of great value to my work for this organization and the individuals and families that we serve. As with our local conference, I not only learn from the presenters, but from the other people attending the conference on a variety of related topics: bowel and bladder management; hydrocephalus and shunts — care and management; non -verbal learning issues; aging and Spina Bifida; orthopedic needs and challenges to name a few. In addition to sessions with professional presenters, there are a variety of sessions that are peer led presentations and discussions which provide opportunities for people to learn from each other. Imagine having over sixteen topics to choose from in any given day!

Vendors

In between sessions, there is always a meal to share or a vendor to visit. Of note this year were the variety vendors whose businesses are geared to greater accessibility to home, community, and the world. Among the vendors present, there were wheelchair vendors, their products ranging from a scooter for under age 3, to a FreeWheel attachment that turns a standard chair into a 3-wheel all-terrain chair, to the Action Trackchair, also designed for all-terrain. Two travel agent companies were available that offer services to travelers with disabilities to assist with planning travel that will meet particular special needs.

Did you know? SBANENY has scholarship money available that is intended to be used to help cover expenses for someone with Spina Bifida to attend a Spina Bifida conference. This could be a national conference such as Beyond Limits. The next national conference is expected to be in June 2018. Are you interested in attending but would like to better understand what it might be like? Please contact Lyndsi or me through our offices. We would be happy to speak with you about it.

What's new with Spina Bifida? Here is a small selection of the information that I picked up at the conference.

- According to information shared during the opening plenary session, **1,500 babies are born with Spina Bifida in the United States annually.** Worldwide, 300,000 babies are born with a neural tube defect with the highest rates in Southeast Asia and Africa.
- ♦ In the United States, through the Center for Disease Control, there are continued efforts to improve health for those living with Spina Bifida and address gaps and inconsistencies in health care. The National Spina Bifida Patient Registry (NSBPR) collects data needed to evaluate medical services for patients with Spina Bifida. Started in 2008, this will provide the information for developing best practices and protocols for health care with the goal to improve quality of care received in Spina Bifida clinics nationwide. The registry continues to grow, now with 7,000 participants ages birth to 83 years old.
- Among the findings is that 19% (1 in 5) people joining the registry report that they have pressure ulcers. Skin care wounds are the 2nd most frequent cause of hospitalization for a person with Spina Bifida. To address this, educational materials are being developed and made available through the CDC, "Healthy Skin Did You Look?" This will be available soon and is one example of the targeted educational information that can be developed as a result of the Spina Bifida registry data. (The most common cause of hospitalizations is urological problems.)
- Research on quality of life suggests that people with disabilities have a higher quality of life than people without disabilities think a person with a disability will have.

Journey Along the Erie Canal

Joined by one of our volunteers and interns this year, SBANENY attended the Journey Along the Erie Canal Reception at Price Chopper Headquarters. If you attended the 2016 Education Day, you may remember John Robinson discussing this event during his keynote speech. In alignment with the theme of our Conference, we were glad to have the opportunity to make connections while showing our support for John Robinson and Our Ability as they continue to do amazing work supporting individuals with disabilities and employment. We look forward to the possibility of having a SBANENY team join the journey next year!

Toolkit for Educators

As you may have seen in our April Newsletter, the Toolkit for Educators committee completed editing the Toolkit for Educators, and the final copy was printed. With the 2016-2017 school year coming up, we are expect-

ing to distribute the Toolkit for Educators in mid-August.

Who can expect to receive a copy?

School personnel: School District Superintendents and Special Education Department/Chair person.

Parents: parents of children who are preschool—high school age (1-18). We are currently drafting a supplemental piece for parents to receive with their Toolkit giving a general overview of the education experience and process for a parent of a child with Spina Bifida.

In addition, we are planning to make a **digital copy available on our** website for educators and parents to visit and share.



SBANENY Internship Program

Since our previous newsletter where we introduced this program, we have been able to offer the SBANENY internship opportunity to another individual with Spina Bifida.

In May, 2016 Bryan Darby was accepted as the second intern to join the SBANENY team. Bryan was extremely helpful in the distribution of the 2016 Conference surveys and with the outreach for the Journey Along the Erie Canal.

VIA TRANSPORTATION

Center for Disability Services

VIA: Value, Independence, & Accessibility, is a shared transportation service for people with disabilities. Shared service means they may transport other individuals during your ride. VIA provides door to door services in fully accessible vehicles for individuals with disabilities.

NOTE:

- ⇒ Riders MUST submit an application and be approved prior to using the VIA service (applications and appointments made online only)
- ⇒ Rides by appointment only
- ⇒ Service is available Monday through Saturday, between 6 a.m. and 10 p.m.
- ⇒ **Serving counties:** Albany, Schenectady, Rensselaer, Saratoga, Columbia, Greene, Fulton, Montgomery, Washington and Warren

Tips for Aging – Preparing your child for the loss of parents/guardians:

- 1. The time to start **preparing is now**.
- 2. Start with age appropriate **conversations** about the topic.
- 3. Teach **social skills** that will increase independence. Encourage and facilitate building **support relationships** beyond you as parent/guardian.
- 4. Go through the details. Especially as your child reaches middle teen to adulthood, they need to know who to talk to, where important information is, and who will be taking over any caregiving roles or needs. Include them in this planning and decision making as much as possible.
- 5. Remember to talk to your adult child about what their role will be in caring for you as you age.







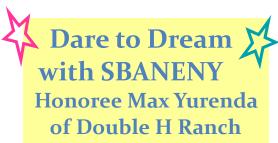

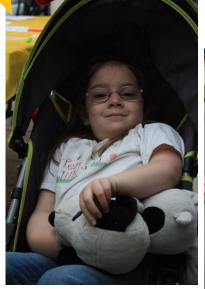
