


SBANENY Program Updates

The number of people impacted by Spina Bifida, which includes caregivers and immediate and extended family, more than triples the number of people who can benefit from SBANENY services. The 2020 Annual Report is now available at www.sbaneny.org. In 2020, SBANENY...

- Advocated with U.S. Congress members and Senators at the national Spina Bifida Association's 3rd annual Teal on the Hill event
- Was included in the Aid to Localities Bill securing funding for programs and services through the NYS Department of Health for the first time in SBANENY's history
- Informed all known consumers when Albany Med established their first ever Adult Spina Bifida Clinic—only 1 out of 28 to exist in the country!
